Placing floral wreath

In his remarks, Ambassador Ahmed paid homage to the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and explained the significance of the 7th March speech. He said 7th March is a glorious and important day in the history of Bangladesh, when the Father of the Nation, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman declared his vision of independence. His clarion call conveyed a clear message to his people that it was time to prepare ourselves for the ultimate struggle to freedom and attain independence. Following his call, after the brutal crackdown of the Pakistani military forces on the unarmed Bengalis on the black night of the 25th of March, the whole country

joined the liberation war and after nine-months of war we became victorious. Ambassador Ahmed termed the 7th March speech as the expression of deep commitment of Bangabandhu for the nation and extreme love for mass people. He also said that this speech gained international recognition when UNESCO enlisted the historic speech as 'World's Documentary Heritage' in the "Memory of the World Register" in 2017 as part of a list of the world's important documentary heritage maintained by UNESCO.

A discussion on the significance of the day was held following the address of H.E. the Ambassador. In this phase, a significant number of Bangladesh community members took part in a lively discussion paying their deep tribute to the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and the role and significance of the historic speech of 7th March in the independence of Bangladesh. The speakers said the 7th of March speech of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman provided inspiration to the Bengali people in their

quest for freedom and emancipation. They expressed their strong commitment to work together to realize the dream of Bangabandhu to build a 'Sonar Bangla' through implementing the vision 2041 of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina by contributing from their respective positions. As the last element of the program, a documentary was screened on the historic March 7 speech.



With due fervor and festivity, the Embassy of Bangladesh, Tokyo observed the 103rd Birth Anniversary of the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and National Children's Day-2023 on 17 March 2023. The day's program began in the morning by placing a floral wreath at the portrait of the Father of the Nation located at the Bangabandhu Ambassador Auditorium of the Embassy. Shahabuddin Ahmed hoisted the national flag along with rendition of national anthem in presence of all Embassy officials and invited quests from Bangladesh community living in Japan. This was followed by the offering of special prayer (munajat) for the salvation of the souls of the Father of the Nation, his family members and for the continued peace, progress and prosperity of Bangladesh. The messages issued by Hon'ble President, Hon'ble Prime Minister, Hon'ble Foreign Minister and Hon'ble State Minister of Foreign Affairs on the occasion were read out by Embassy officials.

Ambassador Ahmed paid homage to the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and explained the significance of the 17th of March. The Ambassador shed light on the life and achievement of Bangabandhu. He also explained how the birth of Bangladesh is intertwined with the birth of Bangabandhu. The Ambassador stated that Bangabandhu had a charismatic leadership quality and magnetic appeal to his people which was demonstrated from the very early years of his life. He possessed a lion-heart full of courage but at the same time kindness and love for mass people including children. The Ambassador mentioned that the theme for this year's Children's Day is "স্মার্ট বাংলাদেশের স্বপ্নে বঙ্গবন্ধর জন্মদিন, শিশুদের চোথ সমৃদ্ধির শ্বপ্লে রঙিন". Referring to this theme of the National Children's Day of this year, the Ambassador said that the dream of a 'Smart Bangladesh' will be realized if the children of our country are taught to be self-reliant, disciplined, and hard-working through modern education in science and ICT, and are raised from an early age as tolerant, respectful, creative and patriotic citizens with humane values. He urged upon all irrespective of age to learn from the life, struggle and ideology of Bangabandhu and impart those qualities in our children.

A discussion on the significance of the day was held where a significant number of Bangladesh community members took part. The speakers paid their rich tribute to the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman. They said Bangabandhu ensured all rights of the children in the constitution of Bangladesh. Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman formulated the Children Act in 1974 and restructured the Girls Guide Association. He also established Kochikachar Melaa children organization with a view to creating an enabling environment for child development. The discussants thanked Hon'ble Prime Minister Sheikh

Hasina for making huge efforts in promoting the rights, wellbeing and future of children especially girls. The participants also called to inculcate in the young minds of the children the human attributes, values and patriotism from the life of the Father of the Nation. A special documentary on the life of the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman was screened.

Since it was a working day and schools were open, the Embassy arranged a program in the evening for children and their family to celebrate the joyous occasion. He also provided an account of successes Bangladesh has achieved in the recent years under Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina for the advancement of children's rights in Bangladesh especially girl child. After this, children charmed all present with their colorful performances. A documentary was screened on the life of the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman. H.E the Ambassador then cut a cake with the cheerful children to mark this occasion. Finally, all the children who participated in the event received a special gift bag from H.E the Ambassador.

The program started with observance of 01 (one) minute silence in remembrance of all martyrs of the dreadful night followed by offering special prayers for the salvation of the souls of the 3 million known and unknown martyrs who sacrificed their lives on 25th March and during the nine-months of Liberation War in 1971. Prayer was also offered to the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and his family members, who were martyred on 15 August


1975. The messages issued by Hon'ble President and Hon'ble Prime Minister on Genocide Day were read out by Embassy officials.

In his remarks of H.E. Mr. Shahabuddin Ahmed, Ambassador of Bangladesh to Japan paid homage to the heroes who embraced martyrdom in the dark and deadly night of 25th March 1971 when Pakistani occupation forces carried out cowardly attacks on the sleeping unarmed Bengalese. The Ambassador said, the main purpose of the Pakistani military's "Operation Searchlight" was to unleash a genocide to kill prominent leaders of

Awami League, students and renowned intellectuals living in the Dhaka and other major cities of then East Pakistan with an aim to crush the independence movement under the leadership of Bangabandhu and establish their control over the province. Ambassador said that soon after the crackdown, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman had declared independence and called upon the countrymen to fight the occupation force till we attained victory.

A discussion on the significance of the day was held. Embassy officials took part in a discussion. The speakers remembered with deep respect all the martyrs who were killed on the terrible night of 25 March 1971. They also recalled with profound respect the architect of the independence of Bangladesh, Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, his role and intrinsic contribution that led to independent Bangladesh after nine-months of bloody war. The speakers said, people from all walks of life including students, teachers, intellectuals, members of different services especially from police and the EPR were killed in the massacre that happened in the dark night of 25th March 1971. As the last element of the program, a documentary was screened on the Genocide Day.



Japan was among the first few countries to open resident diplomatic mission in Dhaka the same year. He mentioned last year, on 10th February, we celebrated in a grand manner the 50th Anniversary of our bilateral relations here in Tokyo where many of guests joined despite COVID related constraints. He said Japan has been a timetested friend and our people always remember with gratitude the precious support contributions of Japan not only during our independence but also later on in our developmental pursuit. Over the years, maintained our bilateral relations based on respect, mutual trust, friendship and cooperation.



Delivering speech by H.E the Ambassador

The Ambassador said, immediately after the independence and Japan's recognition of Bangladesh, Takashi Hayakawa san, who later formed Japan-Bangladesh Association, visited Bangladesh as a Special Envoy of Japan government. Soon after the historic visit of our Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman to Japan took place in October 1973. The

visit laid the solid foundation of a steadfast and lasting friendship. Bangladesh's Foreign Policy motto "Friendship to all and malice towards none" emanates from our Father of the Nation's vision. Due to his pragmatic policies Bangladesh was recognized by most countries and international organizations in a short period of time. H.E. Ambassador stated that our Prime Minister holds

Japan and her friendly people very close to her heart. Following that she visited Japan as Prime Minister in 1997, 2010, 2014, 2016 and 2019 which over the years have further strengthen and deepened our bilateral relations. The back-to-back visits of two Prime Ministers in 2014 bolstered the existing level of bilateral relations to a "Comprehensive Partnership". During the past several years due to continuity in leadership, the relations have developed into multifaceted one. As committed by the leadership of the two countries, we are now poised to take the relations to a new height.

The Ambassador also elaborated on the recent development in our bilateral relations in which our partnership has been robust. He recalled that on 06 December 2022, the Hon'ble Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina inaugurated Japan Special Economic Zone in Araihazar, Narayanganj. Bangladesh also had its first electric run Dhaka Metro Rail (MRT-6) constructed by Japan also inaugurated by the Hon'ble Prime Minister on 28 December 2022. The construction of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Railway Bridge, Terminal-3 of Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport Dhaka and MRT-1 Project, and Matarbari Ultra Super Critical Coal Fired Power Project are also in advance stages of completion. Most of these projects are expected to be completed by 2026, the year Bangladesh is expected to become a developing country. These projects will not only benefit Bangladesh but also will benefit other neighboring countries using Bangladesh as a connectivity hub of South Asia and Southeast Asia. Bangladesh offers the most liberal and investor friendly environment with fiscal and non-fiscal incentives which is the most competitive in South Asia. A country of close to 170 million with 34 million middle-income and affluent class offers to be 9th largest consumer market globally by 2030 beckoning future investors and businessmen to the country. At present more than 340 Japanese companies have their operation in Bangladesh. Bangladesh ranked among top 20 Promising Countries for the 3rd consecutive year in a survey conducted by the Japan Bank for International Cooperation (JBIC). Therefore, there is all the encouraging factors present for more Japanese investors to invest in Bangladesh. We are developing 100 Special Economic Zones, 39 IT/ High-tech Parks and have offered Special Economic Zones to friendly countries. According to recent census, Bangladesh has a young population of 45.9 million, therefore, Bangladesh can provide human resources to Japan by imparting quality education, language and skills. We expect a good number of technical and skilled workforce would join agriculture, manufacturing and production sectors in Japan. The Ambassador concluded his remark by congratulating the fellow Bangladeshis living in Japan, including students, awardees of JDS and other scholarship holders many of whom also attended the event.

All the guests were entertained with iftar and standing buffet dinner where Bangladeshi and Japanese foods were served.
